History

Students follow the **National Curriculum Programme of Study for History**. Topics are selected and are taught on a rolling programme. Students have opportunities to develop a chronological understanding whilst securing their knowledge and understanding of British, local and world history. They have opportunities to identify significant events, make connections, draw contrasts, and analyse trends within periods and over long arcs of time. Students continue to investigate historical events and form arguments and interpretations of how the past has been constructed.
