








work to make sure our students feel empowered and have a say in how they feel aspects of Heathlands should run. Despite the covid pandemic, our student leaders continued to take part in a range of opportunities to develop their leadership skills.

Heathlands School has different focus groups including the Student Council which consist of elected representatives from every for group. These student leaders are led by staff working with them in focus groups. We are proud of them for the qualities that they bring to this position: responsibility, positive leadership behaviour, team -skills and a commitment to improving the life of the Heathland.

This year our student leaders led a number of activities that benefit our students ranging from charity activities to assisting with younger students. They attended training and meetings to plan, lead and evaluate activities. We know our student leaders played a huge part in the school community and worked hard to develop their leadership skills. This is very positive news for us; this shows the student leadership programme is having an impact on developing a positive perception of their leadership skills.

Parents Support group


We have trialed an online group this year run by Zayne. He has enjoyed meeting the parents and discussing various topics about raising a Deaf child.


