Just a mere two weeks later, Heath House then had their Ofsted inspection which we are eagerly awaiting the results.




#### Keeping our eyes on the future



As part of their PSHCE lesson pupils from **Dragon Fruit** class provided Mr Farooq with information on how to care for a dog (in case he is considering buying one).



They learnt to sign a song to remind them what to do.




After completing their exploration logs, **Mango** Class wrote their own holiday brochures to persuade people to visit their planets on holiday.

# Heath House Spring Term 2023

This term: Heath House has been very busy. We have welcomed Naomi to the team. We have also had a residential Ofsted inspection which we are eagerly awaiting the result from. We have also welcomed a new boarder in February. Heath House children have helped to renovate the primary lounge and set up the secondary independence living area. The children have been shopping and chosen the furniture which they like. They then returned to Heath House and helped to build the furniture.

The young people have also been enjoying a range of activities on offer, both in side and outside of Heath House. In addition to this they have continued to develop their skills.



Shopping: This year the children have been developing their independence by learning to go shopping and buying their own cookery ingredients. The children said "We regularly going into town shopping where we often buy cookery ingredients. We learn how to budget money and pay for ingredients".



Soft play: The primary children went to a soft play centre this term where they had a really good time and enjoyed playing around together. One boy said we have fun enjoy play together.





Cooking: This term the children have continued to develop their cookery skills and have enjoyed cooking with staff. In addition to this the year 10's and 11's are now independently cooking each night. One boy said "I enjoy cooking and learning, I also feel more confident in the kitchen now".



DIY: Some of the children helped staff to make the new furniture which we brought for the new primary lounge. One child said "We learn follow the instructions and work together make new furniture in our lounge".



Pancakes: This term for pancake day the CYP all had a go at making their own pancakes. Another child said "I enjoy make pancake I been try flip but go wrong". "It was really yummy".



Roller disco: The children went into London with staff to take part in a roller disco. They had a lot of fun and for a number of them enjoyed learning a new skill. One of the girls said "I enjoy learn how skate but it hard I fall over lots". Another child said "I thought be easy but it hard work really tired after". One other child said "Have loud music and lots of lights".



Skate park: The primary have been attending the local skate park. Where they have been learning how to go on the ramps whilst on both scooters and skate boards. The children have had a lot of and are really developing their confidence. One child said "I like go skate park I have lots fun with friends".



Heath House: Some other Heath House activities the children have taken part in are art clubs, going to the local park, playing basket ball, football, learning to play badminton and table tennis as well as playing dodge ball in the hall or going on the bikes outside.





Year 10 and 11 lounge: The older children enjoyed going shopping, choosing new furniture, building the furniture and decorating their new lounge. The children said "We like are new lounge". "We like relaxing and watch film together". "We like having our own space away from younger children".



Ice-skating: The older secondary children choose to go Ice-skating. Staff booked this for them. They went along and had a really enjoyable time. After this they popped to get some hot food and a hot drink. One child said "I fall over lots but get up have fun. I improve and get better". One other child said "It good fun ice-skating with friends but prefer go roller skate and it not cold".



Primary shopping in town: The Primary children have been learning to walk into town. They have been shopping for treats as well as going into town to buy new board games for Heath House. This has given them a good opportunity to practice their money management skills. They have also developed their confidence in communicating with the hearing public.







Cannot believe it's almost April! We welcomed 2023 with new learners joining our Level 1 fast-track courses, taught by Bethany-Joy. The feedback has been positive with candidates recently passing their 101 assessment and many are interested in progressing to Level 2. Our existing learners, have been working hard and are now over half-way through their courses. With assessments coming up next term they continue to learn new topics plus brush up on current knowledge and skills.

On 17th April 2023 we start our 10-week "Intro to BSL" for young people aged from 8 years to 15 year olds. It is great to see the next generation wanting to learn Sign Language. Here they will cover BSL basics like fingerspelling, greetings, numbers, colours etc. for one hour on Mondays, hopefully piquing an interest to enrol for Level 1





We are in the process of finalising our timetable for 2023/24. Our amazing team are planning to offer BSL Levels 1 to 6. When all is confirmed, the timetable will be available on the Heathlands School website.
