
## Lower School

variety of football skills. In the afternoon, they played a mini 'World Cup' tournament where they represented a country and competed in many matches. The winning team was Haiti followed by China and England.






Student-led **revision lesson** in science. One student made revision cards with questions for her peers to practise answering in a fun way.


Sadly, our lovely year 11 student is leaving. He has been staying in Heath House for 9 years. He enjoyed his last week, as we took him to


