Heathlands School <u>Job Description for British Sign Language Tutor</u> Grade H6 -H9 depending on experience includes outer fringe

1. Purpose of the post

To plan and deliver sign language training courses to students and staff attending the BSL centre. To provide BSL teaching and training to the staff, pupils and parents of Heathlands school. To provide sign language and deaf awareness training to the staff and pupils of partner schools and local community groups.

2. Main Areas of Responsibility

- 2.1 To plan and deliver BSL training courses matched to Signature requirements
- 2.2 To promote the language and communication policies of the school.
- 2.3 To assess individual learners' sign language skills and design, implement and evaluate training programmes.
- 2.4 To support the development of staff signing skills in class where appropriate.
- 2.5 To maintain appropriate written and filmed records.
- 2.6 To determine candidates' readiness for Signature examination entry and actively promote learners' achievement of formal accreditation.
- 2.7 To produce appropriate resources materials to support the delivery of training programmes and consider marketing opportunities for these.
- 2.8 To support the development of BSL in the community through the delivery of sign language/deaf awareness training both within lessons and extra curricular clubs in local schools.
- 2.9 To support the development and implementation of the BSL GCSE for young people.
- 2.10 To advise staff, parents and other learners of externally available training opportunities and actively encourage take up of these.
- 2.11 To be flexible in delivering some training activities outside school hours.

2.12 To work within all policies and procedures of the school.

3. Supervision

The BSL Tutor is directed by the BSL Centre Co-ordinator on a day to day basis and line managed by the Co Headteacher. There will be regular opportunities for consultation and support with formal supervision on a termly basis.
